

BECKWITH-STANDIFORD

Multimodal Safety & Complete Streets Project



The City of Modesto (City), in cooperation with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), proposes the Beckwith - Standiford Multimodal Safety & Complete Streets Project (Project) to improve access, safety and mobility for all travel modes and traffic operations.

CURRENT ISSUES

Collision rates significantly exceed the statewide average



Traffic congestion causes long backups through intersections and onto the freeway



Lack of adequate facilities for bicyclists, pedestrians, transit, and electric vehicles

PROJECT GOALS

- Improve safety to significantly reduce the number collisions
- Reduce congestion and eliminate long backups
- Provide separated and dedicated pathways for bicycles and pedestrians
- Provide modern facilities for transit and electric vehicles



PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

The Project follows the Caltrans Development process which identifies 4 phases of Project development as follows:

PHASE 1

PROJECT INITIATION DOCUMENT:

Completed in September 2024, this phase identified several preliminary alternatives along with their impacts, costs, and schedule.

PHASE 2

ENVIRONMENTAL APPROVAL:

Scheduled to begin in October 2024, this phase includes the selection of a single alternative and the completion of the Environmental Approval process.

PHASE 3

ENGINEERING:

Scheduled to begin in 2026, in this phase, the detailed Engineering plans will be completed.

PHASE 4

CONSTRUCTION:

Tentatively scheduled to begin construction in 2029.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: How can one get more information on the findings of Phase 1?

A: The findings of Phase 1 were summarized in a report which will be released to the public in October 2024.

Q: Are roundabouts being considered for this Project?

A: Yes. Roundabouts greatly improve safety, while reducing traffic congestion and are being considered as a possible solution.

Q: Will businesses be accessible during construction?

A: Yes. Project will maintain business access at all times during construction.

Q: How will the construction be funded?

A: The construction will be funded from a combination of local, state, and federal funds.

Q: Will the Highway 99/Briggsmore Interchange be improved as well?

A: Yes. That interchange is also going through the same development process, but as a separate project.
